1. Work Placement in Austria

Austria was for many years a hosting school exchange organization due to the strict Austrian Foreign Law. During many years Austria only received exchanges under 18 years old who went to school and lived in host families. There was neither visa for volunteers wanting to come to Austria nor any possibility to receive youngsters older than 18 years old.

Thanks to the hard work of many staff members and returnees from Grenzenlos, we were able to get a visa for volunteers. Still, the process is very difficult, and we have many volunteers (especially from Africa) which unfortunately have gotten their visa denied. Unfortunately, due to our very conservative right-wing government the visa situation in Austria has gotten worst. It is very important that the we conduct a program with very few issues, so that the government can even begin to support our work. Your cooperation as a participant is of outmost importance.

2. What are example projects?

The projects you see below are the so-called example projects, as they represent the type of projects, we will be offering next summer or winter. They are existing projects, which illustrate the typical projects we offer, their structure, and the daily activities expected from the volunteers. This could mean though that you get assigned to another project which is similar to one of the example projects.



If you would like to come to Austria and make voluntary work, you will be mostly allocated in a “children’s project” or a school project. Please look at the project examples and choose one that interests you the most (please fill the project form attached). According to your wishes, we will try to find a placement in that project or in a SIMILAR PROJECT.

3. Location of the projects

Most of our projects are in small cities or suburban towns, usually in Lower Austria and the surroundings of Vienna. In this sense, it is very important for you to understand you might not be allocated in a big city BUT in a small town or even in very little RURAL AREAS. If you are used to having noise and people around, then consider this: “If you come to make an exchange here, you will have a one of a kind experiences by living a small town life in a beautiful country”. However, most of the places we offer are close to bigger towns or cities.

4. Accommodation

As mentioned in the National Profile, the host projects are usually the ones that provide the accommodation for the volunteers ... so PLEASE be prepared to live in an accommodation provided by them like: host families, accommodation inside the project, accommodation close to the project, or in an independent accommodation.

5. Your work

Most of the projects will expect from you to be open-minded, motivated and interested in the work they provide in the project. They expect from you as well willingness to learn and confidence to ask when you do not know or whenever you do not understand something. Creativity and self-initiative are two great factors that will guarantee a rich learning experience. We recommend you try them, try to be creativity and self-initiative because it would be tedious, monotonous, and bored if you just follow a Schedule without your lust and input. Don’t be scared to ask for and to propose activities, we know that they are waiting for your Creativity.

IMPORTANT: not every day will be “full of new experiences” and not every task will as exciting as the last. **ROUTINE WORK** like helping cleaning, preparing food for the children or clients, and helping with the organization of events, are extremely important tasks, which will improve your skills and will help the project to run smoothly. You will be from time to time or on a regular basis, in charge of this kind of tasks so be prepared to do this type of work! If you have never cooked or even grabbed a mop before, well it’s time for you to start practicing.

THEME OR TYPE OF PROJECT	Education/Children
AIMS OF THE PROJECT	<p>We are a private organized childcare institution and we take care of children at the age of one year till they start school. We want to provide a comfortable and safe environment for our kids on the pedagogic concept of Maria Montessori and Emmi Pikler.</p> <p>Dr. Maria Montessori called her daycare centre for children in Rome "casa dei bambini" - The Children's House. She had observed that children learn best in a homelike social environment with appropriate materials, which support each individual's unique development. She maintained that children are respected different from adults and like individuals</p>



	<p>who are different from one another, that they educate themselves through purposeful activity and absorb and learn spontaneously from their environment, which includes people as well as materials.</p>
PROJECT'S ACTIVITIES	<p>We look for a nice male or female volunteer, who loves to be with little children and wants to help us to make every day enjoyable. We expect your enthusiasm, your input and ideas. The main idea is to have a person from another country and to let children learn about this country, culture and language by his/her daily presence. The project of the volunteer will consist of introducing different aspects of his /her culture into the leisure time program of the children and to give an extra helping hand.</p> <p>The kids arrive between 7 and 8.30 a.m. In the morning time they can stay with their friends or start working with the offered Montessori material or move and play in our gymnastic room.</p> <p>At 9 a.m. we eat together a small snack: fruit or vegetables, bread with butter, and if somebody celebrates his birthday, we eat a birthday cake. After eating all kids bring their plates to the kitchen and wash their hands. At 10 a.m. we start with our morning circle, we sing songs, do fingerplays, check who is present and who is ill or on holiday.</p> <p>Then each child can choose, if it wants to work in the Montessori room or do a creative work with one of our pedagogues or to practice gymnastics with some Pikler instruments. Two instructors are looking for max. 12 kids and help them whenever needed. Every day we go in our private garden and the kids can play and enjoy fresh air (also in winter!) At 11.30 am we eat our fresh cooked lunch and from 12 to 2 pm the kids can sleep, relax or do more silent activities. Starting from 2 to 4 pm, the parents can pick up their children.</p>
VOLUNTEER'S REQUIREMENTS	<p>They will like to host a Spanish and English native speakers. The intern should be motivated to work with children, be able to work independent and to bring Enthusiasm and motivation to the project. AIMS OF THE PROJECT	We are a private Montessori Children's Group with an integrated forest educational theory; in the group we have 14 children, between ages of 18 months and 6 years, 2 Montessori pedagogues and a dog. Our goal is to raise the children entrusted to us in a family-like, loving atmosphere and to support them. We base our education on the teachings of Maria



	<p>Montessori; Maria was born in Italy in 1870. She was a great philosopher, scientist, pediatrician and a reforming pedagogue.</p> <p>Maria developed the theory that children have a natural desire to learn. Based on this, she made the principle of her teachings to be “Help me to do it myself”. Many Montessori institutions are internationally lead.</p> <p>Forest educational theory – we spend one day a week in the forest with the children. There, they get to know the animals, trees and plants. They build structures for the animals and explore nature.</p>
<p>PROJECT’S ACTIVITIES</p>	<p>7:30am- Children arrive. Some kids will choose Montessori materials to work with; others help with preparing breakfast or pick up a book.</p> <p>9am- All of the children have arrived. We eat breakfast together.</p> <p>9:30am- Morning circle- we greet each other, talk about the day ahead, sing songs and play games.</p> <p>10am- We go to the park or continue working on projects.</p> <p>11am - Cooking and quiet exercises.</p> <p>11:30am - We have lunch, the little ones are swaddled and put to bed, then we clean up.</p> <p>1pm- The older children work with materials for language development and mathematics.</p> <p>2:30pm- The little ones wake up. We eat snack.</p> <p>3pm- We’re at the park or the children play freely.</p>

PROJECT'S ACTIVITIES	<p>St. Martin has two living groups/communities and several practice rooms, where the clients work during the day. They offer the clients housing, (re)integration in the surrounding society, leisure time activities and a workplace through training in our work shops.</p>
VOLUNTEER'S REQUIREMENTS/SKILLS	<p>There are no special requirements. A volunteer/intern should be in general interested and enjoy working with disabled people of different ages. Reliability is also important when working the clients from St. Martin. No previous working skills or experience is required.</p>
VOLUNTEER'S TASKS	<p>The volunteer will support the staff and the clients with the daily program. In the main he/she will help them when they take meals, to dress themselves, accompany them to work, which is two streets away from the residential home, going for a walk, playing games, taking trips, doing some gardening, practicing sports, going shopping.</p> <p>The volunteer will participate in the regular team</p>



	meetings as well. He or she should work for about 30-35 hours per week and is entitled to two days of holiday of every month.

AIMS OF THE PROJECT	Waldfexxx is a private organized childcare institution and offers a special form of kindergarden in a wooden area near Krems/Donau/Lower Austria. The children are exclusively in open nature, no matter



	<p>what the weather is like. There is a tipi situated in the centre of the area that serves as premises of the “kindergarden”. We were the first in Lower Austria to find such a special institution. The focus lies on fulfilling the individual and personal plan of inner development of the child based on self-determined and active learning processes.</p> <p>Free play is an important part of everyday life in Waldfexxx as playing is important for the child’s development. Children learn the social rules of living together, gain knowledge by experience and thus become smarter with each playing sequence. Playing provides the ideal background for the child to develop its personality and its abilities. Playing is important for the wellbeing and the psychological balance as it enables children to repeat what they have already learned and thus can add to the depth of their experiences.</p> <p>Another focus in the Waldfexxx kindergarten lies on motion. Motion is the starting point of any further learning experience. As the children choose their personal form of motion the learning experience takes place almost “on the side”.</p> <p>As nature changes constantly, the area in which we stay on a daily basis remains the same. This ensures the feeling of safety that the children need in order to follow their needs and learning processes. In addition, the children can perceive and experience the changes nature is going through in the course of the year, and these processes of living and dying form part of their inner experience as a matter of course. The child perceives itself as part of a bigger entity.</p>	
PROJECT’S ACTIVITIES	<p>The children are aged between 3 and 7 years and a pedagogical team of three persons is there to accompany them throughout the mornings. It is important to us that there is at least one male team member. About 39 kids take part in the program. Opening hours are 8:30 am – 12:30 pm. There is additional team time for the staff members of about 2 hours in the afternoons once a week.</p> <p>It is our goal to support the children in their activities and it is the role of the adults – according to Maria Montessori – to help the children to do things themselves. This would also be the main task of the volunteer. It is essential for the volunteer to</p>
