TO KNOW MORE ABOUT THE REGIONS, PLEASE SEE THE NATIONAL PROFILE.

SIIJUVE's projects are carefully selected and frequently monitored to assure the best experience for our volunteers. The projects are public, non-governmental, and religious institutions that work in one or some of the following areas:

- street
- children/adolescents,
- orphan children,
- children/adolescents with difficult backgrounds,
- animal welfare, ecology,
- elders, community development, education, refugees, etc.

We are frequently forming new alliances with projects in Mexico to fit the interest and abilities of our incoming volunteers and to enhance collaboration within Mexico's civil society.

In Mexico, we live a situation of economic inequality, low support from the government, among others. Strengthen collaborations is the key for the survival of social projects in the country so we are looking for new alliances all the time. If we place you in one of these new projects that might not appear yet in the Work Profile, we ask you to be open about it.





STREET CHILDREN/ADOLESCENTS



There are more than three million children and adolescents living and working in the streets of Mexico. Projects like Juconi help these children to find a life outside the streets. It is not just about providing them a house, but to change their perspectives, teach them a profession, and make them feel secure, among others.

LOCATION Puebla, Puebla.

THEME OR AREAS OF PROJECT

Children / disadvantaged / street children / human rights/family

AIMS OF THE PROJECT

JUCONI seeks and provides personalized support to society's most vulnerable children and families trapped in toxic cycles of family violence and chronic poverty.

PROJECT'S ACTIVITIES

JUCONI works with 350 children and their families every year, through 3 programs:

- Program for children living on the streets, and their families.
- Program for children working in the streets, and their families.
- Program for children working in the markets, and their families.

JUCONI coordinates with parents, siblings, teachers, neighbors, employers, etc. in order to attain, and more importantly, sustain the transition of children, from exclusion to inclusion. The holistic approach assures permanent success in 4 key areas:

- Academic achievement: The project grants access to education.
- Positive social relationships: The project creates abilities to foster and maintain positive bonds with peers, neighbors, and authority figures.
- Economic opportunities (14 years and older): The project creates and promotes the abilities and values necessary to succeed in the formal workforce.
- Family: The project fosters positive, violence-free communication within families.

COMMUNITY CONTEXT

One of Mexico's greatest challenges is poverty; millions of children find themselves in an unacceptable situation without opportunities to develop healthily or access their rights.

Without society's support, children who grow up in these conditions can seldom break out of this vicious circle. Most likely, they will repeat the same patterns of violence as adults with their own families.

VOLUNTEER'S REQUIREMENTS: Volunteers require skills for working with children, such as patience, initiative, and energy. **Basic knowledge of Spanish is required.**

VOLUNTEER'S TASKS: The activities can include:

- Assisting the teachers during their lessons and workshops.
- Participate in activities organized for street children.
- Take care of children whose parents work all day.
- Take part in preparing things, (such as cookies etc.) This helps to raise money for the project.
- Visit families.
- Monitor programs.

THEME OR AREAS OF PROJECT

Children/youth / disadvantaged / street girls/art/education

AIMS OF THE PROJECT

The main objective of Yolia is to offer girls, which have lived in the streets and are at risk of exploitation and violence, education with a gender focus based on the preventive system of San Juan Bosco, which favors an integral development and impels them to be protagonists of their own stories.

PROJECT'S ACTIVITIES

Social Circus: The Social Circus is a pedagogical and social-artistic intervention tool that develops physical, artistic and social skills in children, young people, and families.

Mobile School: The Mobile School is a tool that helps strengthen and impact the self-esteem of children and young people living in on the streets or in vulnerable situations through positive and creative impulses.

Salesian House: The Salesian House is a space of encounters with children, adolescents, and young people from the peripheral colonies that look to form values and develop skills to prevent youth from getting involved in dangerous situations.

The activities offered are:

- Workshops: Dance, Music, Drawing, Crafts, Papyrus
- Sports activities: Football
- Children's Center: The Children's Center is an educational space that favors the development of habits, and psychomotor and cognitive skills of children from 1 to 6 years of age, who are children of young mothers in street situations and/or with low resources.
- Youth Residence: In the Youth Residence, we provide comprehensive care for street girls and adolescents who are unaccompanied migrants, through reinsertion and prevention strategies that promote harmonious development and community participation.
- Orphanage: We have a residential space that offers security and stability, which contributes to rebuilding the family structure, promoting harmonious development and projecting a dignified life option for girls.

COMMUNITY CONTEXT

- Girls from 0 to 21 years old located in dangerous zones of Mexico City.
- Street girls or girls that are in danger of living in the streets.

VOLUNTEER'S REQUIREMENTS:

- The volunteer must be educated
- Possess human values, believe and practice them.
- Responsible
- Sensitive
- Patient
- Willing to learn Spanish the fastest possible

VOLUNTEER'S TASKS:

- Pay attention and support the beneficiaries of the program
- Make visits at intervention spots with the mobile school and social circus.
- Motivate and include children in activities.
- Participate in games with children at intervention spots.
- Participation in the daily activities of the household (preparation of food, accompany girls to school, supervise activities, promote personal hygiene and clean spaces).

Children / disadvantaged / street girls/education

AIMS OF THE PROJECT

The aim of the project is to improve the living conditions of street children, by offering a warm place where they can sleep, and by giving them food and education.

PROJECT'S ACTIVITIES

- It helps youth and children to reintegrate into society, by giving them education and basic needs.
- Protect girls from the danger of living in the street, helping them to find a new and positive future.

COMMUNITY CONTEXT

The volunteer will be working with girls who have a difficult background.

VOLUNTEER'S REQUIREMENTS: Volunteers require skills for working with children, such as patience, initiative, and energy. **Basic knowledge of Spanish is required.**

VOLUNTEER'S TASKS:

- Interest in working with children
- Responsible and motivated to help others
- Computer skills
- Desirable: Basic level of Spanish and English

CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS WITH DIFFICULT BACKGROUNDS



Children and adolescents with difficult backgrounds are those who have family problems. The problems can range from poverty, sexual abuse, physical abuse, etc. Many of them have lived in the streets or are orphans, but not necessarily. Some of the projects function as orphanages, but others take care of children and adolescents for periods of time.





LOCATION Puebla, Puebla.

THEME OR AREAS OF PROJECT

Children / disadvantaged / education/nourishment

AIMS OF THE PROJECT

The main objective of “Comamos y Crezcamos” is to support families with low resources by improving the nourishment of their children. The project also looks to develop the academic and physical skills of children.

The secondary objectives of the organization are:

- Improve the nourishment of children attending kindergarten to elementary school.
- Increase school attendance through good nutrition.
- Encourage the habit of hygiene both in the preparation and consumption of food.
- Strengthen education with values and family involvement.
- Improve the quality of life and strengthen the knowledge, attitudes, and practices regarding children’s food, nutrition, and health.
- Encourage children to be interested in their education by providing artistic, cultural, and sports activities.
- Meet the needs of children in various villages of the State of Puebla.

PROJECT’S ACTIVITIES

- To feed children with low income
- To assist them with psychological consultancy
- To help them with their homework after the meal
- To provide them with several artistic and sportive activities.

COMMUNITY CONTEXT

Puebla is one of the five provinces with more poverty and marginalization in the country. Children tend to be the ones that suffer the most from the consequences of it. Especially, poor children under 5 years old suffer of malnutrition and low productivity at school.

The project is located in a poor neighborhood, “Nueva San Salvador”, besides the highway and big industrial parks. Its population is migrants from La Sierra Negra.

VOLUNTEER’S REQUIREMENTS:

- Able to take initiative
- Responsibility
- Independent
- Able to organize activities for children

VOLUNTEER’S TASKS:

- Serve lunch to the children
- Be a teacher’s assistant.
- Help to prepare the material for the class.
- Look after the children while playing

HOST SITUATION: Host family in the city of Puebla.

THEME OR AREAS OF PROJECT
Children/disadvantaged

AIMS OF THE PROJECT

“Guardería Infantil Caritas” is a nursery and school for children whose parents work all day and don’t have enough economic resources to pay for a private school or nursery. The age of children can be between 5 months to 6 years old.

PROJECT’S ACTIVITIES

This project takes care of children for 6 hours every day. During this period of time, the children receive food and basic education, play games, and others.

COMMUNITY CONTEXT

The project is a private association located in the center of the city of Puebla.

VOLUNTEER’S REQUIREMENTS:

- Volunteers need to have an interest in working with small children and babies.
- Volunteers are also required to be patient.

VOLUNTEER’S TASKS:

- Take care of the babies (feed them, change their dippers, etc.).
- Assist teachers
- Play with the children, help them with their homework, feed them and look after them.

THEME OR AREAS OF PROJECT

Children / disadvantaged / education

AIMS OF THE PROJECT

Casa del Sol helps vulnerable children from 0 to 8 years old to develop their full potential and to find them a family. The project provides education and a house for homeless children.

PROJECT'S ACTIVITIES

The project offers a home for children and babies. It also looks for adoptive parents. Finally, they assure good education to their children, through an alliance with a near kindergartens and elementary schools.

COMMUNITY CONTEXT

The project is located in one of the richest parts of the city.

VOLUNTEER'S REQUIREMENTS:

- To be German
- Enjoy being with young children and/or babies
- Basic Spanish is desirable.
- To have patience with children and lots of energy.
- Age between 18 – 26 years old.
- Willing to work on the same activity for a long time (for example sorting socks for some hours.)

VOLUNTEER'S TASKS:

- Play with the children
- Accompany children in their therapies
- Make beds
- Clean children's toys
- Help the children to eat
- Help the children to change their clothes
- General tasks in the house: sorting clothes, helping to look after the babies, feeding, changing their nappy

THEME OR AREAS OF PROJECT

Children/disadvantaged

AIMS OF THE PROJECT

To help children who are at risk of living on the streets or who are already homeless, providing them with protection, affection, and understanding. In addition, provide education and development strategies that shall contribute to the recovery of their self-respect and enhance their possibilities of having a good life during adulthood. The project also has other activities such as taking care of disabled people. When the volunteer arrives, he/she together with the project manager, will decide their area of work.

PROJECT'S ACTIVITIES

- DIF is a public institution that offers a real option for children who are at risk of living on the streets or who are already homeless.
- DIF provides a house for children to play, eat, do their homework, etc. Within DIF, there is a school where kids can attend.
- Homeless children have the opportunity to stay in the house, while DIF finds them a permanent home.

COMMUNITY CONTEXT

DIF is part of the local government. It works with the most vulnerable sectors of society. You will work with street children, children from poor families or children without parents.

VOLUNTEER'S REQUIREMENTS:

- Volunteers need to be tolerant and should have a lot of patience.
- Punctuality, positive attitude, motivation and initiative for activities with the children.
- Desirable: Basic level of Spanish.

VOLUNTEER'S TASKS:

- Provide language classes. (English - basic level)
- Teaching songs, games and intercultural activities in a different language
- To take care of children during their daily activities
- Provide computer lessons
- Play sports with children.
- You will work with children from 5 to 15 years old

NUMBER OF VOLUNTEERS IN PROJECT: 4

HOST SITUATION: Host family in the city of Toluca.

HOLIDAYS: According to the program, plus all the official holidays.

TIMETABLE: Monday to Friday. The schedule will be designated by the project.

LOCATION Tuxtla Gutiérrez, Chiapas.

THEME OR AREAS OF PROJECT

Children / youth / elders / integral development / poverty and exploitation / sexual abuse

AIMS OF THE PROJECT

Granito de Arena is an international organization that looks to have a positive impact in the life of the most vulnerable (elders, children, and youth with difficult backgrounds).

The secondary objectives of the organization are:

- Provide basic needs and psychological support to the elders.
- Protect and provide psychological support to children and youth, victims of sexual abuse and/or work exploitation
- Create campaigns against children sexual abuse

PROJECT'S ACTIVITIES

- “CUIDA POR AMOR” (CARE FOR LOVE)

A campaign to raise awareness of children sexual abuse. The organization organizes chats with experts, conferences, movie screenings, and others. They also create and distribute informative material (flyers, etc.)

- “ADOPTA UN ABUELITO” (ADOPT A GRANDPARENT)

A support program for elders who are homeless or abandoned by their families. The organization provides material needs (food, wheelchairs, diapers for adults, etc.) and organizes events. The main objective is to provide love to the grandparents and treat them with respect and good intentions.

- DEJA TU HUELLA (LEAVE AN IMPRESSION)

A program to involve the local community in the organization's activities. The organization organizes donations, cleaning and reforestation campaigns, and also a yearly race to increase awareness about sexual abused children.

- CENTRO DE ATENCIÓN INTEGRAL PARA NIÑOS Y JÓVENES VIOLENTADOS SEXUALMENTE (SUPPORT CENTER FOR SEXUALLY ABUSED CHILDREN AND YOUTH)

A Center to support children and youth, from 3 to 25 years, who have been sexually abused. The center provides psychological support and different types of therapies for the patients.

COMMUNITY CONTEXT: The participants of the project are people with difficult backgrounds, so they can be hard to approach.

VOLUNTEER'S REQUIREMENTS:

- Patience
- Responsibility
- Ethical person
- Affectionate
- Discretion
- Seriousness

VOLUNTEER'S TASKS:

- Support in orphanages
- Support in nursery homes
- Help in the organization and implementation of fundraising events
- Participate in workshops about sexual abuse to learn, and later provide the same workshops in schools (together with an expert)
- Organize and provide several workshops for kids
- According to the profile and disponibilities, the volunteer will be able to support in administrative areas

NUMBER OF VOLUNTEERS IN PROJECT: 1 to 2

HOST SITUATION: Host family in the city of Tuxtla.

HOLIDAYS: Depending on the volunteer's program

TIMETABLE: Monday to Friday from 11 am to 5 pm

THEME OR AREAS OF PROJECT

Art / disadvantages / children / youth

AIMS OF THE PROJECT

The project aims to help children to develop their creativity and enhance values like self-esteem.

PROJECT'S ACTIVITIES:

The project runs different art workshops:

- Painting and drawing
- Engraving with linoleum
- "Papier Malite"
- Collage
- Performance, etc.
- The volunteers are free to create a new workshop.

COMMUNITY CONTEXT

The project works in poor communities in Tuxtla Gutierrez.

VOLUNTEER'S REQUIREMENTS:

- Volunteers should have a lot of imagination, initiative and like cultural activities such as painting, drawing, etc.
- The volunteer also need to have patience and energy to work with children.

VOLUNTEER'S TASKS:

- Help to organize and implement the workshops in diverse communities of the city.

CENTRO ASISTENCIAL DE DESARROLLO INFANTIL (CADI)

LOCATION Ocotlán, Jalisco.

THEME OR AREAS OF PROJECT

Children / education / human development / disadvantaged

AIMS OF THE PROJECT

CADI looks to protect and care for children, from 6 months to 6 years old, who are in vulnerable conditions. CADI also promotes a culture of prevention and responsibility for the families.

PROJECT'S ACTIVITIES

- Provide initial and preschool education to children
- Provide health care services, counselling, food, and shelter.
- Provide parental guidance
- Provide educational services to the children.
- Take care of children of working mothers
- Teach human values to kids

COMMUNITY CONTEXT:

- Children of single working parents, who are exposed to situations that endanger their physical and emotional being.
- Most of the children come from dysfunctional and poor families.

VOLUNTEER'S REQUIREMENTS:

- Responsible
- Respectful
- Interest in working with children
- Patience and energy
- Preference: basic level of Spanish

VOLUNTEER'S TASKS:

- Support with sports lessons
- Play with children
- Support in cooking
- Assist the teachers
- Check that children's belongings (clothes, shoes, etc.) are clean, complete, etc.

NUMBER OF VOLUNTEERS IN PROJECT: 3

HOST SITUATION: Host family in the city.

HOLIDAYS: Depending on the volunteer's program

TIMETABLE: Monday to Friday. The schedule will be designated by the project.



LOCATION Guadalajara, Jalisco.

THEME OR AREAS OF PROJECT

Children/youth / integral development / education /emotional support

AIMS OF THE PROJECT

The project's goal is to contribute to the integral development of children and adolescents in vulnerable situations (psychological and learning problems), in order to promote their personal and social growth.

PROJECT'S ACTIVITIES

We are divided into two areas:

- Children Development Center(CENDI): it supports children and adolescents to complete their primary and secondary education, through a comprehensive training and support strategy (School breakfast, ethics classes, sports lessons, nutritional monitoring, psychological support, and flag ceremonies).
- Family Development Center (CEDEF): it gives psychological support to children with learning disabilities and/or negative conducts. It also provides family activities to build healthier and harmonious relationships.

COMMUNITY CONTEXT

Most children and adolescents participating in the project have malnutrition and lack of emotional support.

VOLUNTEER'S REQUIREMENTS:

- Basic English
- Proactive
- Empathetic and sensible to other's people situations
- Patience and responsibility
- Teamwork
- That they like working with children and adolescents.

VOLUNTEER'S TASKS:

- Support in daily tasks
- Help in the organization and implementation of workshops

NUMBER OF VOLUNTEERS IN PROJECT: 5

HOST SITUATION: The volunteer will live in the project or Host Family in the city of Guadalajara.

THEME OR AREAS OF PROJECT

Children / youth / integral development

AIMS OF THE PROJECT

Albergue Infantil los Pinos AC. was founded in 1987 in order to support children in vulnerable situations and extreme poverty, by providing them with the tools to become good citizens, self-sufficient humans and promoters of a better society.

Children and adolescents come to our Albergue from difficult backgrounds (Lack of love, malnutrition, and depression/fears caused by psychological and sometimes physical abuse).

The project has two houses:

- House of Children: Serving 70 children from 4 to 12 years old
- Youth House: Serving 30 minors between 13 and 18 years old.

The project acts as a home for children who for whatever reason have none.

PROJECT'S ACTIVITIES: Albergue Los Pinos fundamental tasks are:

- Help the children to solve emotional problems through therapy.
- Help children to regain their self-confidence and love for others.
- Provide them with the necessary tools for necessary social integration.
- Provide professional support to the children, youth and their families.

COMMUNITY CONTEXT:

The volunteer will be surrounded by children and adolescents with physical, social, cultural and emotional damage. The majority have learning disabilities, and health, nutrition, and hygiene problems. The beneficiaries of the program come from violent and poor colonies.

VOLUNTEER'S REQUIREMENTS:

- Be patient with children and adolescents.
- Tolerance towards frustration
- Empathy and sensitivity to other people's situation
- Teamwork and responsibility
- Good presentation.
- Fast learner and capable of understanding and following the educator's decisions to deal with the kids
- Interest in fieldwork
- Proactive
- Punctuality

VOLUNTEER'S TASKS: The volunteer will support in different areas:

- Support in teaching tasks
- Support in recreational activities
- Accompany the beneficiaries of the program
- Monitor data records.
- Promotion of ecology and cultural activities.
- Support in administrative tasks
- Support in the coordination of the program.

NUMBER OF VOLUNTEERS IN PROJECT: 3

HOST SITUATION: Host family in the city.

AIMS OF THE PROJECT

“Pro Niños de la Calle“ aims to understand and assist children and teenagers living in the streets. “Pro niños” guides street children in a three steps process which allows the children to choose a different way of living. The process helps the children realize that they can decide on their own and that the streets are no longer the place in which they want to live.

PROJECT’S ACTIVITIES: The organization offers an alternative way of living (safe housing and education) to street children. Also, they stimulate the physical, emotional, intellectual and creative development of the children. There are four areas of work:

- **Street Work:** The Educators and volunteers work directly in the streets, in order to make contact with street children and gain their trust. The main objective is to convince children to attend the Day Center. The educators use technics based on games.
- **Day Center:** The aim of the Day Center is that children decide by themselves to leave the streets. In the Day Center, educators and volunteers perform different activities in order to encourage new habits on the children; help them to discover new skills; and finally, so the children can compare their new lives with the ones in the street. At the Day Center children are provided with food, leisure activities, education, and medical support.
- **Life Option:** Once the children decide to leave the streets, the project helps them either to go back to their families (if it is possible and there are adequate conditions) or to live in a residential project for street children. Fundación Pro Niños de la Calle also supports them to start with a new independent life.
- **Transition house:** It is a house where older boys stay before becoming independent and leave the project facilities. In this house, they are prepared for their future.

COMMUNITY CONTEXT: Fundación Pro Niños de la Calle I.A.P. is a Non Governmental Institution located in Mexico city. Mexico City is one of the world most populated cities. It is also the City with more museums in the world and it is full of events, restaurants, and activities to do. Nevertheless, Mexico City also has several social problems, and one of them is the high number of street children. Some of these children have been abandoned and others prefer to leave their families because they are abuse by them.

VOLUNTEER’S REQUIREMENTS:

- **Street work** is done in pairs, usually one educator and one volunteer. The volunteer and educator pick up children in the street and takes them to the Day Center. In the Day Center, the volunteer plays and takes care of the children. At the end of the day, the volunteer and educator take the children to shelters.
- In the **Day Center**, volunteers help educators in diverse activities. One of the most important tasks of the volunteers is to keep all the material in order and ready for the activities. Children consider volunteers as educators; and therefore, it is very important for the volunteer to show empathy and support. The volunteer also needs to watch out children very closely in order to identify the attitudes of the children. Other activities are: play with the children, teach them new skills, and others.
- At **Life Option and Transition House**, volunteers support the staff and children with daily activities, and with the process of integrating the youngsters into society.

Ecology /sea turtles

AIMS OF THE PROJECT

Protect and conserve Sea Turtles in the State of Jalisco.

PROJECT'S ACTIVITIES

- Recover and protect sea turtle nests in Mayto beach: Nests are constantly monitored in an artificial incubator
- Protect the beach from ecological damage by cleaning, recycling, etc.
- Awareness camps for students and tourists: During the camps, participants can take care of turtles, free them, learn about recycling, clean the beaches, etc.
- Awareness Campaigns for the local community: The project teaches the community to use their resources sustainably. Also, they teach them to keep up with their economic activities (fishing and tourism) without hurting the turtles.

COMMUNITY CONTEXT

Mayto Beach is located in Cabo Corrientes, Jalisco. The beach is near the towns of Mayto, Tehuamixtle, Villa del Mar, and Ipala. The town's main economic activities are fishing and tourism. The project works closely with them, especially children and youth.

VOLUNTEER'S REQUIREMENTS:

- The project asks for an extra fee around 120 euros per week
- Ready to stay at the beach for a long time. The project counts on limited wi-fi and rustic accommodation for workers and volunteers.
- Fondness for nature, especially wild animals.

- Good physical condition to do hard work in hot weather.
- Readiness to work during the nights and long hours (when there are camps, etc.)
- Proactive and with basic knowledge of camping
- Basic level of Spanish or willing to learn fast.
- Know how to swim. Preferable if you know how to dive too.

VOLUNTEER'S TASKS:

- Night Patrol: Fundamental activity for the protection of sea turtles, and to avoid looting. The volunteer will have to do around 4 hours of surveillance in ATVs. The volunteer will search for sea turtle nests, recollect the eggs, recollect relevant information, and transport the eggs to a secure zone in the camp.
- Monitor the incubator: Make sure that the eggs in the incubators are well sheltered. Controlling the temperature, humidity, light, etc. is essential for successful hatching.
- Cleaning of nests and liberation of baby turtles: Once the baby turtles are born, the volunteer needs to register the number of them and clean the nests before freeing them on the beach.
- Maintenance of the camp: Volunteers will carry maintenance work, like gardening, construction, painting, cleaning common areas, and others.

At Integra, they keep a very peaceful atmosphere and make sure that everyone receives special attention.

- Mainly, the volunteers need to be patient because he/she will be surrounded by people with mental incapacities and learning is slower.
- It is also important to be sensitive and positive.
- The volunteer needs to be very open and try to talk to them and gain their trust.
- The project does not ask for any technical or manual skills, but they prefer if the volunteer speaks a little bit of Spanish because no one in the project speaks another language and it can be very frustrating for the volunteer, staff, and youngsters.

- Check each piñata.
- Help them in the process when someone requires it.

- **SPECIAL-CARE PROGRAM FOR CHILDREN:** It consists of intensive interventions designed to address the particular needs of each child. Experts in the project combine behavioral and humanistic methods such as TEACCH, LPECS, ABA, among others. The result is specialized programs that address all aspects of child development, including language, social relations and behavior. These programs provide support as the axis of teamwork with the families of these children.
 - **Remote Mode:** Valora has distance learning programs for students who cannot attend the center because of financial reasons.
- **SCHOOL INTEGRATION:** Through this program, beneficiaries who have a higher degree of progress, are partially integrated (at first) into both individuals and private regular schools.
- **PRE-EMPLOYMENT WORKSHOPS FOR BEGINNERS:** With the aim of contributing to the insertion of the beneficiaries into the workforce, the project offers training and workshops. This program has managed to start training 10 children in manual skills (embroidery and weaving) and cooking (chopped and food production). It aims to ensure equal opportunities.
- **AWARENESS AND TRAINING:** VALORA trains parents, school members, and others to assure social participation in the topic.
- **RESEARCH:** We collaborate and participate in national and international research with universities and other organizations.
- **GRANTS:** Valora is an institution that understands the needs of families who have a child with autism, especially if the family does not have the financial resources to cover expenses. To meet these needs, Valora has generated economic projects, infrastructure, equipment, and training, among others; with the firm intention of helping children, youth and adults with autism to improve their living conditions.

COMMUNITY CONTEXT: The project assists children and youth, from 3 to 20 years old, with autism. The families come from all social ranks, but at least 60% of them are poor.

VOLUNTEER’S REQUIREMENTS:

- Teamwork: be able to work with children, other volunteers, and therapists.
- Commitments: be responsible and respectful at all times.

- Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday the volunteer will help in the workshops given to older students.
- The volunteer will keep and present reports.

AIMS OF THE PROJECT: APAC serves poor people with cerebral palsy, from birth to adulthood, by providing education services and comprehensive rehabilitation. Secondary objectives are:

- Provide individualized education to our students looking to achieve their maximum development in an environment that promotes self-esteem, and encourages socialization with peers.
- Achieve the maximum possible rehabilitation of our patients through early detection and design of customized physical and psychological rehabilitation programs.
- Provide special training and necessary tools so they can get a job and achieve self-sufficiency, independence, and social inclusion.
- Create awareness of the needs of people with cerebral palsy through advice, training, and participation in human rights organizations.

PROJECT'S ACTIVITIES: APAC I.A.P. provides comprehensive rehabilitation (biological, psychological and social) for people with cerebral palsy, from childhood to adulthood. In order to achieve the former, the project works as a center of rehabilitation, with different areas of services:

- Educational services:
 - Provide schooling from pre-school to high school to our participants.
 - Provide non-formal education for young people through different recreational workshops and training.
- Rehabilitation services (physical therapy, occupational therapy, hydrotherapy, and communication):
 - The project has an early intervention service for high-risk babies. This is a preventive program where they teach the parents how to monitor their baby and encourage his/her development.
 - Provide individualized and customized attention to each one of their students.
 - Provide food to participants. The food is prepared and brought to the center by their parents. The project team supports students that, because of their level of disability, cannot feed themselves independently.
- The Psychology Department provides family caregiving courses, talks on specific topics and group/individual therapy. We also provide individual therapy to students who request it. The project detects that they require this service.

COMMUNITY CONTEXT: Most of the families that attend APAC are poor people. Students are divided into 3 educational centers according to their age and/or skills:

- Early Learning, Preschool & Elementary: This group consists of infants from 18 months to 3 years old who come with their parents twice a week.
- Middle and High School
 - Groups organized according to the Secretary of Public Education (SEP) criteria (by age).
 - Groups organized according to the National Institute of Adult Education (INEA) criteria (by interests and cognitive abilities)
- Education and Social Integration Centre: Form by young people that cannot or do not want to continue with formal schooling. The project provides workshops and training.
