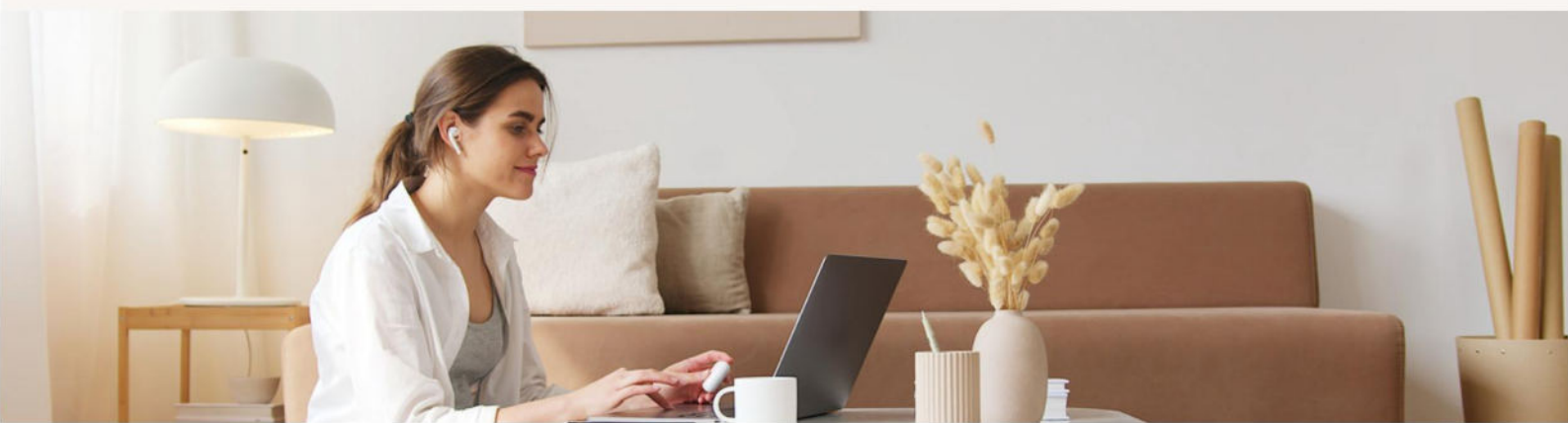

CSM WORK CAMP CONCEPTION

A work camp is a sort voluntary service. The participants in this activity try to work together for a common aim. This means that all the participants must be actively involved in this service and be well motivated to do it. A work camp is also an opportunity for young people to exchange experiences and to achieve an intercultural learning process so as to build a word of peace and mutual understanding. The work greatly varies from one project to the other. It normally involves Construction work in remote educative, social and cultural establishments, nature conservation work, and restoration of historical monuments, bricks molding, health and Aids awareness campaigns, sanitation projects such as digging water wells and erecting Blair toilets. The communities may ask us to perform other specific tasks outside the scope of our agreement. This is seen as a way of promoting intercultural understanding. CSM organize s some special projects such: Cultural program- Language Teaching- Easter Camp- Summer camps Medium/Long term Program

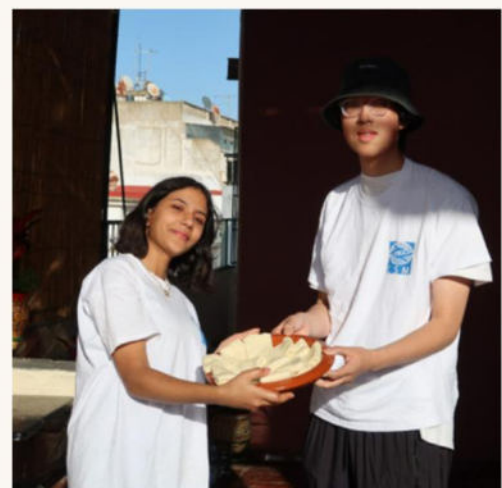

ABOUT OUR PROGRAM GENERAL INTRODUCTION

In this section, we provide detailed information about the various fields of work available through our program. Volunteers are requested to review these options carefully and identify the areas that align most closely with their interests.

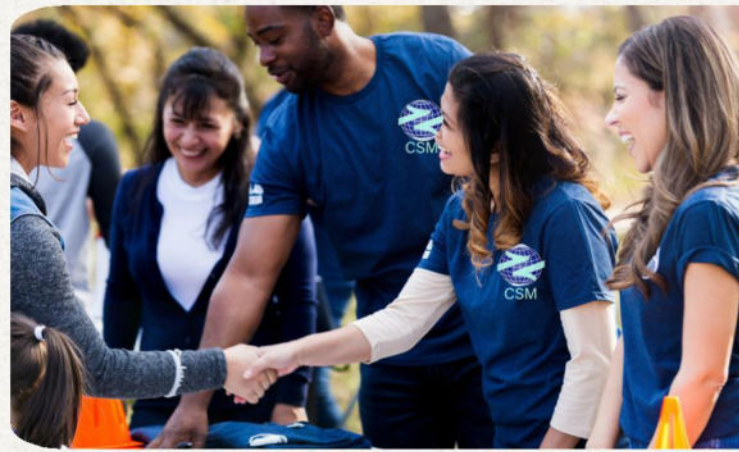
[Additionally, a Motivation Letter is required, accurately describing themselves, their skills and interests, past work experience, strengths and weaknesses, etc. This information helps us match the project and the volunteer as accurately as possible.]



Once the application is accepted by the Sending organizations, project placements are organized on an individual basis according to the preferences stated in the application form. It is crucial for volunteers to be specific about their interests, experience, and project choices in the application form.

CSM Morocco places volunteers on a “first come - first serve” basis, so some projects may fill up quickly. If a volunteer’s first project choice is unavailable, we will offer their second or third choice, or ask them to reapply at a later date when a spot becomes available.

While we strive to place volunteers in their top choice, we cannot guarantee it every time due to factors like availability of spots, time duration, distance, etc. Changes to project placements and hosting accommodation are considered only under special circumstances and only after volunteers have made sufficient efforts to adapt and overcome initial challenges. Therefore, participants are requested to make significant efforts to stay in their assigned placement for a minimum of one month before requesting a change. In our experience, it takes at least a month to adapt to a long-term project and new surroundings.



LMTV PROGRAM ORIENTATION OVERVIEW AND INTEGRATION GUIDE

Volunteers need to apply through our partner organizations in their home countries. Here's what the program involves:

****Placements:****

We finalize volunteer placements within a week of receiving applications.

****Arrivals:****

Volunteers must arrive at either Rabat airport or Rabat ville train station. CSM will send necessary information, including a pre-arrival letter, info sheet, general details, and travel instructions, at least one month before arrival.

If you arrive at any other airport in Morocco, you can reach Rabat by train; check the schedule and connections at www.oncf.ma.

The program begins with a 3-day orientation at our office in Rabat.

****Registration:****

Registration will be completed during the first week after arrival.

After orientation, volunteers will start their projects in various locations, depending on their placement.

Each volunteer will have an LTV Coordinator from CSM upon arrival. This coordinator supports volunteers, monitors their progress through visits, cultural meetings, one-on-one sessions, emails, phone calls, and reports.

Volunteers are expected to submit a Final Feedback report and Final Evaluation report at the end of their program. These reports detail their work, progress, challenges, solutions, and suggestions for future volunteers and CSM Morocco. They serve as references for new volunteers and help CSM Morocco improve its programs.

In the "LTV/MTV Project Information" section, volunteers are asked to carefully review the available fields of work offered through our program. Each applicant must select a minimum of three fields of interest in order of preference on their application form. Additionally, a Motivation letter detailing their personal information, skills, interests, past work experience, strengths, weaknesses, etc., is required. This information helps us match volunteers with projects as accurately as possible.

Once the application is approved by the sending organizations, project placements are arranged individually based on the volunteer's stated preferences. It's crucial for volunteers to be specific about their interests, experience, and project choices in their application form. Projects are assigned on a "first come, first served" basis, so some popular projects may fill up quickly. If a volunteer's first choice is unavailable, we offer their second or third choice, or suggest they apply again when a spot opens up.

While we strive to accommodate volunteers in their preferred field, we cannot guarantee it every time due to factors like spot availability, duration, and distance. Changes to project placements and housing are only considered under special circumstances, after ensuring the volunteer has made sufficient effort to adapt and overcome initial challenges. Therefore, we encourage all participants to commit to their assigned placement for at least one month before requesting a change. We believe this time frame is necessary to adapt to a long-term project and new environment effectively.

ORIENTATION

We will provide an opportunity to all volunteers to meet some of our Host Families who will share their past experience of hosting volunteers and also to clarify any questions volunteers may have about living with a Moroccan Host Family. Lots of new and interesting things will be introduced during sessions. Meeting people will make you feel right at home. Therefore, we will provide volunteers the opportunity to visit market places, Moroccan families and natural sites in groups or individually during their free time. How volunteer should There are some simple rules, which can help volunteers have a smooth integration with each other and with the local people. This will also help overcome the culture shock! All volunteers are requested to bring items from their home such as photos, music, food, handicrafts, etc. that will help them present their country and culture to other volunteers as well as to the local youth and your Host Family. This methodology adopted during the orientation week, aims at turning the theoretical sessions as dynamic and participatory as possible.

All our projects are based in Rabat, the capital of Morocco, easily accessible by taxi, tram, or train. If you arrive directly at Rabat Airport, we can arrange a pickup. Otherwise, the meeting point is Rabat Ville Train Station.

From other airports in Morocco, you can reach Rabat by train. Check schedules and connections on www.oncf.ma.

Once you have your flight details, please email them to your contact person of your sending organization so we can arrange the pickup.

An information sheet will be emailed to you three weeks before your departure. Orientation is mandatory for volunteers applying for three months to one year.

VISA REQUIREMENT

Please Note that according to the new Visa Regulations, volunteers coming from Europe to Morocco don't need a visa but they are allowed to stay only 90 days

- CSM will try to extend your visa one week before the ended of your 90 days.
- Alternatively, you can travel to Ceuta (Spain) and come back the same day again: this will allow you to stay for another 90 days.

- They welcome, listen to, inform, and guide children with Down Syndrome and their families.
- They promote inclusive education and encourage individuals towards self-determination.
- They assist families and young people in developing personalized life plans.
- They implement projects to enhance social integration in family, school, work, sports, and cultural settings.
- They support the physical, intellectual, and moral development of individuals with Down Syndrome in line with their aspirations.
- They advocate for and facilitate the social integration of people with Down Syndrome.

****Volunteer Tasks:****

- Volunteers play a pivotal role in these projects by bringing joy into the lives of these children and assisting the NGO in making structural improvements to their daily routines to prepare them for adulthood.
- Tasks include maintenance and gardening, meal preparation and service, cleaning, and providing companionship.
- A creative approach is beneficial, allowing volunteers to initiate new projects or activities. Flexibility is crucial as volunteers may need to undertake multiple tasks.

Volunteering in such projects offers profound opportunities for personal growth while making a meaningful impact on the lives of others.



Centre lalla Meriem

The center Lalla Meryem, part of the Moroccan League for the Protection of Children, provides care for orphaned children from birth to six years old. Some are left by their mothers due to personal circumstances, and others are brought in after being found abandoned on the streets. The center can accommodate up to 200 children, including 123 currently residing there, 50 of whom have disabilities such as cerebral palsy, trisomy 21 (Down syndrome), motor impairments requiring wheelchairs, or mental disabilities like autism. Specialized social workers and doctors at the center ensure they receive appropriate care.

Orphaned children at Lalla Meryem benefit from social, medical, and educational support, attending Rabat's public and private schools starting from age three, with nurses providing care until then.



****Volunteer Tasks:****

Volunteers assist with daily tasks like bathing, taking walks, and meal preparation under the guidance of specialized social workers. They also engage in:

- ****Orphan Care:**** Facilitating adoption processes, organizing activities, and providing medical support.
- ****Integrated Classes:**** Supporting children in mainstream education through partnership programs with public schools.
- ****Activities:**** Organizing educational, sports, artistic, manual, and cultural activities.
- ****Age-Specific Focus:**** Tailoring activities to support personal development, socialization, and educational integration based on age groups (4-7, 8-11, 12-16, and 17-20).

The project aims to enhance the quality of life for disabled and orphaned children, nurturing their potential and preparing them for future achievements.

****Project Overview:****

FIELD SCHOLAR SUPPORT

At kindergarten in Rabat, children learn through play and exploration. Our educational approach encourages active learning, critical thinking, and creativity through a variety of indoor and outdoor activities. We follow the full Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) , offering flexible preschool and daycare options to support families.

As a volunteer, you'll play a crucial role in supporting the children's development. You'll assist with the preschool transition, helping young students adjust to their new routine. Your responsibilities include organizing playful and educational activities, feeding the children, and teaching them basic skills. You'll also participate in organizing events that promote positive behavior, such as Tolerance Day and Pink Shirt/Blue Shirt Day. Our morning assemblies focus on teaching essential social skills through activities like expressive arts, including art, music, movement, dance, and role-play. These activities provide children with opportunities to express their thoughts, ideas, and feelings in a fun and supportive environment. Volunteers enrich the learning experience by engaging with children in meaningful ways, fostering their curiosity and growth in a nurturing setting.



****Project Aims:****

The aim of this project is to provide free academic support and linguistic reinforcement to children currently attending kindergarten in Morocco's public schools. This initiative addresses the lack of trained teachers, particularly in English language education, due to overall low education levels. Private summer lessons, although available, are often unaffordable for most families. By offering free scholar support, the project aims to empower disadvantaged students from an early age to achieve higher academic levels.

****Volunteer Tasks:****

Volunteers will work closely with children from economically disadvantaged families. Their role includes:

- Providing academic support and linguistic reinforcement through tailored lessons.
- Teaching and engaging children in educational activities.
- Organizing and participating in sports activities to promote physical well-being.
- Observing and appreciating everyday life habits and culture through practical and social involvement.
- Passing on important skills for each child's personal and academic development.
- Collaborating with national volunteers to engage in community activities beyond kindergarten settings.

****Activities:****

- Task Assignment: Clearly define the tasks and responsibilities of each volunteer based on their skills, interests, and the needs of the project. Here there are few examples .



Play and Exploration Activities:

- Engage children in indoor and outdoor play activities that promote physical activity, social interaction, and creativity.
- Organize games that encourage teamwork and problem-solving skills.

Educational Support:

- Assist children with learning basic skills such as counting, recognizing letters, and simple words.
- Read stories aloud to the children and engage them in discussions about the stories.

Arts and Crafts:

- Lead art and craft sessions where children can express their creativity through drawing, painting, and making simple crafts.
- Encourage children to explore different art materials and techniques.

Music and Movement:

- Organize music and movement sessions where children can dance, sing songs, and play musical instruments (if available).
- Teach simple songs and dances that promote coordination and rhythm.

Outdoor Exploration:

- Take children on nature walks around the kindergarten area, pointing out different plants, insects, and natural elements.
- Set up outdoor exploration activities such as scavenger hunts or sensory exploration with natural materials.

Social Skills Development:

- Facilitate activities that promote sharing, taking turns, and resolving conflicts peacefully.
- Model and encourage positive behavior through role-playing and group discussions.

Health and Well-being:

- Help children with basic hygiene routines such as handwashing and tidying up after activities.
- Teach children about healthy eating habits through activities like preparing simple snacks together.

Special Events and Celebrations:

- Assist in organizing and participating in special events like cultural celebrations, themed days (e.g., Tolerance Day), or field trips.
- Help decorate the kindergarten for seasonal holidays and celebrations.

Languages and Communication:

- Engage children in language-rich activities such as storytelling, puppet shows, and simple conversations.
- Introduce children to basic phrases or songs in different languages if applicable and appropriate.

Assistance with Daily Routines:

- Support teachers in daily routines such as meal times, nap times, and activity transitions.
- Help maintain a clean and organized environment by tidying up play areas and organizing materials.

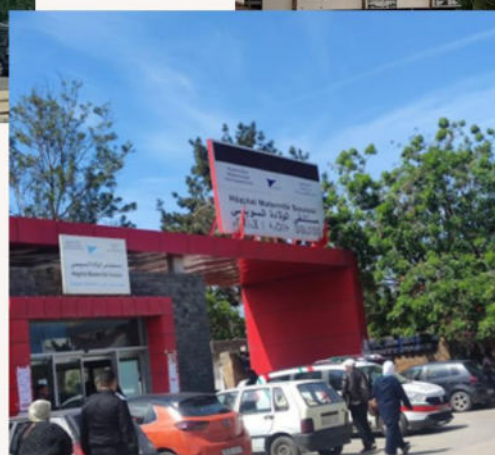
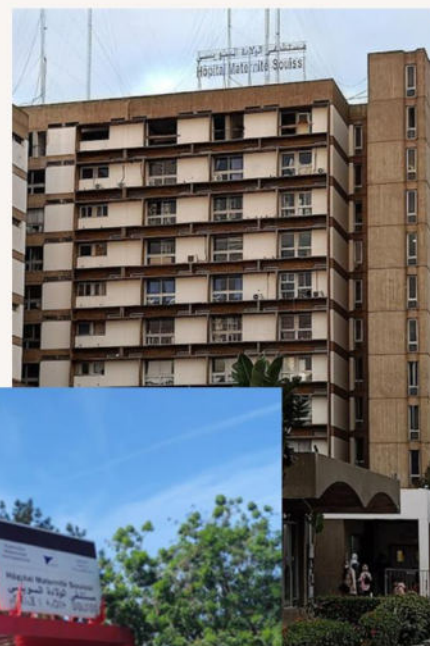
