The main site of REMAR is located in Machava, one of the neighborhoods of Matola Municipality. It is in a residential area. It offers some facilities and is very ease connected to Maputo and Matola cities by regular transportation system.

Project's activities

REMAR houses and schools assist over 200 children and youth. It also works in drug rehabilitation.

The organization takes in people who have nowhere else to go. They have different houses for different groups of children, which are situated in different areas of Maputo and Matola, though the main project camp is situated in Machava, a few kilometers outside the city.

In Machava there is: A girl's house (situated 5 mins walk away from the main site); Two boy's houses; A Church; A School; A Bakery; a factory alongside a warehouse; and the house of one missionary family.

The babies' house and drug rehab centre are situated in different areas of Maputo. They have two shops in the city centre where they sell second hand items. The office and main housing for the people in charge are situated in Museu area the city central district.

Volunteer's tasks

- Volunteers are expected to work with the children and not in the drug rehabilitation activities.
- As a volunteer in Remar you have not have a role unless you create one yourself; this gives you the freedom to be creative.
- The volunteer will be working outside of the school schedule, so you will not be formally teaching.
- You will be given the freedom to choose the age group and gender of children you wish to work with.

Production of furniture, bags and other materials using local materials like wood, metal, leather and reclaimed materials, combined with quality training and creation of fair jobs for young vulnerable Mozambicans.

As we are in the beginning of the new training program volunteers will be actively engaged in the set-up of the training programs next to in the daily running of the production centre. The tasks will be partly in the office and partly in the workshop assisting the workshop chef, working with the young trainees and in the creation of the furniture and other objects.

Tasks will be:

- Assisting in the set-up of the training program;

- Assisting in the preparation of the training center and acquisition of equipment,
- Logistical assisting expert trainers;
- Assisting workshop chef with daily tasks;
- Working with the young craftsman (if wanted);
- Documenting expert training's (recording with video equipment and editing);
- Assisting in the design and development of new objects (if wanted).

With PdP there is place for a lot of creativity next to the opportunity to learn furniture making, welding, spraypainting and other skills. We are a hands-on project where volunteers will work alongside young Mozambicans, learn about setting up of projects, learn new skills and be actively involved in training and production.

The project has two sites. One site in the central and urban area of Maputo. Generally, the communities offer ease access to diverse kind of facilities like banks,

including ATM, internet access, hospitals/health care centres, local transport from one place to another (especially between home and work placements), shops, entertainment and so on.

The other site is located in one of the suburbs neighbourhood of Matola, Kongolote. The area is mainly residential offering some basic services. The volunteer will be working in the two sites depending on the schedules of the work planned.

Description of the organisation

The Associação Mãos Que Falam – AMQF, is an organization working with young people who are deaf or carriers of auditory deficiency, promoting their integrated social-economic and cultural development. The association is composed of 80 deaf people and 8 interpreters of the Mozambican Sign Language (MSL), the majority being adolescents, youth and few young adults. The association offers a meal daily, a space to socialize and various courses to promote empowerment and self-sufficiency.

The AMQF has the following aims:

- The education of the carrier of auditory deficiency in Mozambican Gesture Language (MSL);
- Ensuring access to learning as well as scientific and professional knowledge;
- Social integration;
- Intervention in cultural barriers and difficulties lived;
- Involvement in various institutions as development and transformation agents;
- Demythologization of deafness in Mozambique (where it is seen as a disease, disgrace, or curse), thus contributing to a wider integration of the deaf in their family and society.

The AMQF includes several activities on day to day, which includes talks about family planning, HIV/AIDS, health care, life skills, etc. We also promote short term vocational trainings in sewing, embroidery, painting, decoupage, fuxico, crochet, carpentry, silk-screening and others. We bet on diversity and coexistence of cultures and rhythms. Our ultimate goal is to democratize and Decolonize musical artistic production, and contribute to the enrichment of culture, such as resistance to a globalisation that tends to become invisible and mix some practices and knowledge. We believe that in this way, also contribute to the conservation of musical memory of peoples.

We position ourselves from a profound respect for nature. It is our source of inspiration, and also provides the raw materials that allow us to produce musical instruments. XITATA has a strong commitment to the sustainability of natural resources and by a production with the lowest possible ecological damage.

of instruments of artisan way, claiming the value of manual work and care outside the production in series.
