Introduction

Nepal Volunteers and Cultural Youth Exchange Program (NVCYE Program) is a distinguished non-profit organization, officially registered with the Social Welfare Council of the Nepal government. Established in 2004, a noble mission drives the organization: to empower local communities through community development, education, and initiatives.

At the core of NVCYE's activities are various volunteer programs designed to address diverse needs. These encompass short and long-term opportunities in teaching, childcare support in schools and hostel, construction projects, and organic farming. Additionally, the organization offers avenues for involvement in social media and marketing, healthcare initiatives, renovation programs, women empowerment and more.

Notably, NVCYE operates independently of government or corporate funding. The organization relies solely on the benevolence of volunteers and contributors to advance its programs across various sectors. This financial independence underscores the commitment of NVCYE to its grassroots initiatives and highlights the importance of community engagement in driving positive change.

We kindly request our volunteers to fill in a registration form, paper from police that you are not convicted of a felony & accept basic cultural rules and regulation. You agree to dress appropriately, respecting the culture of Your Host Country and Host Family. By joining our volunteer program, you need to agree that you have evaluated the Covid situation and to take all the necessary precautions including vaccinations, and insurance requirements as per the regulations of the country you are travelling to.

Short-term volunteers are available throughout the year. Volunteers should commit to a minimum of four weeks and a maximum of twelve weeks.

Long-term volunteering Long-term volunteering programs typically begin in August and January and last for 5-10 months. January can as the starting date for a five-month program.



Volunteers can stay in Nepal for up to ten months by renewing their visas every three and two months.

The weekly fees for volunteer programs such as Monk Teaching, Organic Farming, and Medical Volunteering are expensive than other program fees like, organic farm social media, Teaching, and Childcare.

- **Visa Requirements:** We generally suggest our volunteers get a pre-arrival visa. However, depending upon your nationality, you may obtain a tourist visa upon your landing in the air terminal in Nepal too. For more information regarding the visa please click [here](#). - **Personal Appearance:** In Nepal, personal hygiene is very important, and people tend to dress neatly. Be prepared to cover your shoulders and knees, and wear clothing that is not revealing or extravagant even when it is hot. You may wish to bring a range of options from casual to business casual, like what you might wear at home. We Suggest our volunteers to cover tattoos and remove facial piercing while volunteering.
- Make sure your passport is up to date. To enter Nepal, your passport must be valid for at least 6 months after your program start date.
- **Documentation:** Please do NOT carry your passport around with you in Nepal. We recommend keeping your passport in a safe place and carry a photo or photocopy of it.
- Write down your credit card contact information in case you lose your card.
- **Police Report:** If you are volunteering in Nepal Police Report is required.
- **Money Exchange:** near to government rule. It is a good idea to exchange money from the bank. The currency of Nepal is Rupees (Rs). USD and Euro are widely accepted; however, the exchange rate is based on local trend You must have your original passport with you to exchange money. There are ATMs all around Nepal, mostly in Kathmandu valley capital city of Nepal. You can with draw cash simply using normal debit card, Master card, Credit for a small fee.



- **Covid - 19:** Traveling to Nepal no longer requires proof of full COVID-19 vaccination or a negative PCR test report. However, it is advised to check official websites before flying.
- **Dengue:** Dengue viruses are transmitted to humans by the bite of an infected Aedes species (Aedes aegypti or Aedes albopictus) mosquito. It may be found all over the world in tropical and subtropical climates, particularly in urban and semi-urban areas. Almost half of the world's population around 4 billion people, live in dengue-risk areas.

Dengue fever is the leading cause of sickness in high-risk areas. There is no specific treatment for dengue, although the warning symptoms of Dengue includes stomach pain or tenderness, persistent vomiting, clinical fluid accumulation, mucosal bleeding, fatigue, restlessness, liver enlargement, and postural hypotension. You may avoid mosquito bites by using following ways.

- Use an insect repellent that has been approved by the EPA.
- Dress in long-sleeved shirts and pants.
- Permethrin should be applied to clothes and equipment.
- Sleep with a mosquito net over your head.
- Prevent Bug Bites

Living

We're here to make your time in Nepal awesome! We'll pick you up and drop you off at the volunteer house and project. You'll get to enjoy tasty local meals and comfy accommodation. On weekends, we'll be there to make sure you have a blast and create unforgettable memories.

Kathmandu has cool places to visit, and most places accept credit cards, so it's convenient for you. Just keep in mind, in Nepal, things like electricity, Wi-Fi, and hot water might not be as consistent as back home. It's part of the adventure, though!

Arrival

At the volunteer house, the local program coordinator will conduct an orientation and briefing session, covering essential topics such as Nepalese culture, greetings, local transportation, and nearby locations. Following this, you will be taken to your project site.

- For flights, we require the date, arrival time, airline name, and flight number.

Accommodation Rules

Some of the rules are designed to protect you and other participants:

- No smoking and not drinking alcohol in your accommodations.
- Drugs are forbidden. Consumption or possession of drugs will be reported to authorities, and you will be immediately removed from the program.
- Overnight guests are NOT permitted in host family accommodations.
- To dress appropriately and conduct yourself professionally.
- We expect all our participants to be present and punctual.

Volunteers for this teaching project in Nepal will have the unique opportunity to immerse themselves in Buddhist tradition and spirituality while sharing their passion for and understanding.



Qualification or skills



You do not require to have any specific knowledge or qualifications; however, you must be able to communicate effectively to the monk's children. You will be working in a religious setting that is likely to be very different from your own, you must be culturally sensitive. Monks may participate in various religious activities at different times of the year, the format of your volunteer program may change. We request you to be flexible to accommodate changing situation.

Volunteers Requirement:

- Volunteers must be at least 18 years old.
- Participants should not have any types of criminal convictions and should provide a clean criminal background and check report.
- Volunteers should have positive energy, confidence and able to motivate children and be soft to the children.



- Volunteers should be open-minded and have a good attitude for working with children.
- Should be able to make a schedule for teach monks.

Volunteers Tasks

Volunteering as a teacher to children in a Buddhist monastery is a deeply rewarding and unforgettable opportunity to give back. This project requires the volunteers to be respectful to the monks and abide by the rules at the monastery. As a volunteer, you will also witness and participate in traditional Buddhist rituals while organizing games, paintings, drawings, and other creative activities for the young monks. You will get the chance to learn and immerse yourself in Buddhist culture.

Other Activities:

- ☐ Make educational activities with the monks, where they can practice according to their own language level and encourage those to speak English more openly.

Monastery

It depends upon the location; volunteers will be placed inside the monastery or in the NVCYE – P hostel. Volunteers must strictly follow the rules of the monastery during your stay in the monastery. Basic Nepali Food will be provided to volunteer lunch, snack, and Dinner. Volunteers will share a room with another international volunteer participating in the same program.

Teaching English in Private and Government School

English is an international language and good knowledge of this language makes children compete in international level for lucrative job opportunities. The public private school and government schools are often underfunded and lack experienced teachers, making it difficult to learn the precious English language for the poor children.



Our aim is to improve educational facilities, facilitate adult training programs, or create lesson plans and other resources to support our educational work with children and adults. Over school holiday and exam times, participants on teaching programs might assist with running holiday programs for local students or contribute to the other projects listed above.

Gram Sudhar Lower Secondary School is in Gokarneshwor, Kathmandu, Nepal. Gokarneshwor lies in the northern part of Kathmandu, 10 km from Thamel and 15.1 km from the ICYE hostel.

The area is rich in history, dating back to the Kirant Dynasty, and holds deep spiritual significance. Known for the Gokarneshwar Mahadev Temple dedicated to Lord Shiva, it is an important religious site where various rituals, including Gokarna Aunsi (Father's Day), are performed. The peaceful environment, combined with the rich cultural heritage of the region, makes Gokarneshwor a must-visit destination.

Gokarneshwor Municipality in Kathmandu, Nepal, is home to a variety of ethnicities, including Newar, Hyolmo, Sherpa, Rai, Limbu, Gurung, Brahmin, Chhetri, Tamang, and Magar. Most people belong to middle-class families. About 98% of the population is Hindu and celebrates Hindu festivals.

Personal Appearance:

Emphasize personal hygiene, cover shoulders and knees, and wear modest clothing. Cover tattoos and remove facial piercings while volunteering.

Other Activities:

- Develop activities according to the student's needs, prioritizing listening, Reading, and speaking classes.
- Go hiking; go on an educational tour, and other activities. So that students can have an authentic experience in their learning.
- Be a role model.

- Can teach Mandarin and Spanish if you are from Mandarin and Spanish Background few classes in a week.

PLEASE NOTE: *As a volunteer, you are responsible for your, Day Snack, Bottled water and daily transportation to and from your project site. Local bus rides are very affordable, and a one-way trip rarely costs more than Rs35(0.26 EUR). Taxis are more expensive, and costs vary based on distance travelled. Food also you can get in an affordable price which cost less than a euro.*

Food and Accommodation:

Host Family

Volunteers will stay with host family. You will be sharing rooms with international volunteers of the same gender participating in the same program. Three meals a day (lunch, snack, and dinner) will be provided during your stay. The food is prepared in local style. Main types of food will be rice, lentil soup and vegetables.

Note - It is important to keep in mind that in most developing countries services such as electricity, Wi-Fi, and hot water may be less consistent than in your home country.

Living

Upon your arrival at the airport, our office representative will warmly welcome you and escort you to the volunteer house. At the volunteer house, the local program coordinator will conduct an orientation and briefing session, covering essential topics such as Nepalese culture, greetings, local transportation, and nearby locations. Following this, you will be taken to your project site.

Volunteers who joined the 8 - 10 months long term program must take one week language and cultural program. This program includes learning daily used basic Nepali language skills and gaining insight into local culture. It also features a one-day cooking class, a cultural dress photoshoot, and a one-day sightseeing tour within the Kathmandu Valley.
